How to reach Vorarlberg

Vorarlberg is within easy reach on all routes and all means of transport. The system of public transport is extremely well developed. Train and bus services are closely dovetailed in the Vorarlberg Transport Network.

... by car

From the north via Singen-Friedrichshafen-Lindau or Singen-Konstanz/Kreuzlingen-St. Gallen, via Ulm-Memmingen-Lindau. Via Augsburg or Munich-Memmingen-Lindau or Nürnberg-Ulm-Lindau.

From the west via Zürich-St. Gallen or Zürich-Walensee-Sargans.

From the south via Como (I/CH)-San Bernardino-Chur, Brenner motorway (I/A)-Innsbruck or Reschen pass (I/A)-Landeck.

From the east via Innsbruck-Arlberg road tunnel or Arlberg pass road or via Reutte-Lechtal-Bregenzwald (Note: the L 198 Lechtal road from Warth nach Lech is usually closed in winter). The Kleinwalsertal can be reached on the A7 via Memmingen-Kempten-Immenstadt or Füssen-Immenstadt or Lindau-Immenstadt (B308), then continue via Sonthofen and Oberdorf.

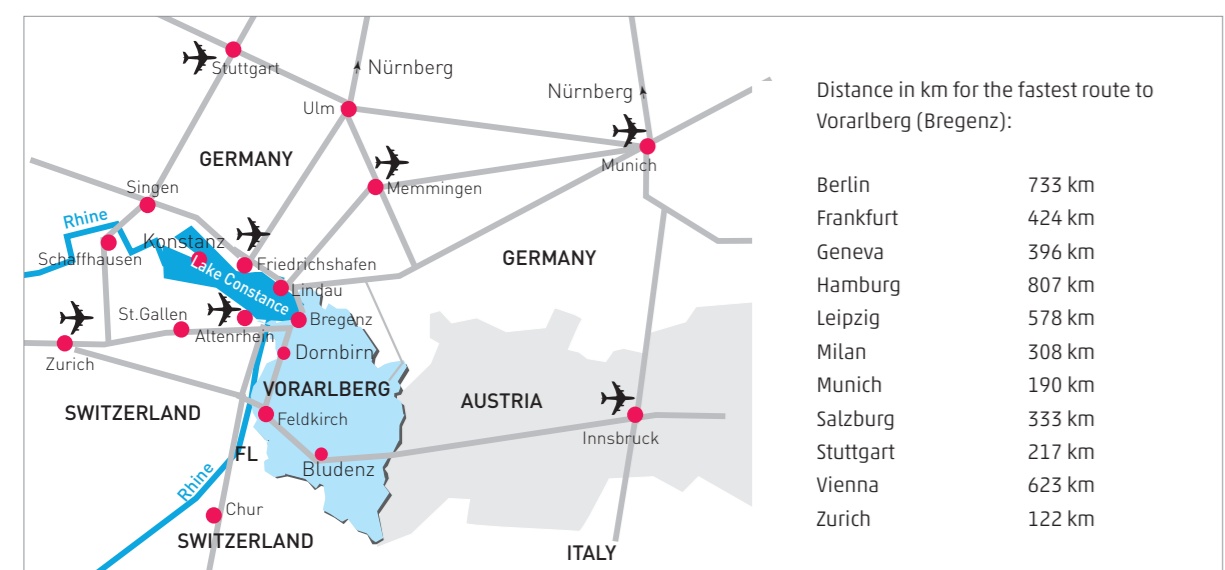

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Adventure Destination Vorarlberg

Vorarlberg nestles in Austria's very west, closely neighbouring Germany, Switzerland and the principality of Liechtenstein. Pleasantly small in size, this Austrian region is known for its inspiring mix of high-carat culture and awe-inspiring nature.

Witness spectacular opera performances on the floating stage of Lake Constance. Marvel at the harmonious blend of traditional and contemporary timber architecture. Let your thoughts wander freely in the bracing alpine climate. Explore the wonders of nature together with your loved ones - Vorarlberg invites visitors to discover the unknown and to live those once-in-a-lifetime moments.

The landscapes between Lake Constance and the mountains which rise up to 2,000 m and more, stun the eye. Towns and villages surprise with their interesting buildings. Nowhere else in Austria does one find so much well-designed contemporary architecture within such a small area. In recent years, many hotels have undergone a thorough facelift and now

present themselves in new design. Natural materials create a special aura of well-being.

The cultural scene is truly cosmopolitan: the annual Bregenz Festival in July/August has been a tourist magnet for many years. Riveting opera is performed in spectacular productions on the floating stage of Lake Constance. Lovers of classical music flock to the Schubertiade festival in Schwarzenberg und Hohenems. The poolbar festival in Feldkirch in the summer celebrates pop culture and design. Housed in a glass cube, Kunsthaus Bregenz is a museum of contemporary art. The Vorarlberg museum in Bregenz deals with Vorarlberg's past and present. The modern *Werkraum Haus* in Andelsbuch showcases Bregenzerwald craftsmanship and artistry.

Vorarlberg's many award-winning inns and restaurants serve regional cuisine with an innovative twist. Be it fish caught in Lake Constance or mouth-watering mountain cheese, many delicacies are sourced from small businesses, farms or delicatessen manufacturers.

Holiday-makers keen on activity can head for the mountains, either on foot or by cable car, reaching dazzling panoramic lookouts. Themed trails, some of which are fitted with interactive stations, tell about water, forests, moors, fauna and flora. Artist-designed trails stimulate the senses. Wherever you look, Vorarlberg's landscapes are cultural landscapes in the truest sense of the word.

Six welcoming regions

Vorarlberg stretches some 100 km from north to south and stuns visitors for its scenic variety. From the shores of Lake Constance with its near Mediterranean feel it is just an hour's drive by car across gently undulating hills to the high alps. Shaped by different landscapes and forms of living, every one of the six holiday destinations has a distinct character of its own.

Arlberg

More time - more space
Its reputation is legendary, its name stands for passion - the Arlberg. In Lech Zürs am Arlberg holiday-makers find "More space for their thoughts and more time for the senses". As a summer treat, the Lech Card is available free of charge for visitors staying one night or longer.
Idyllic, leisurely, pampering: Stuben am Arlberg is lined by the Lechtal alps and the Verwall group; the laidback village of Klösterle enjoys a romantic setting against the foothills of the Arlberg mountain.



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Bregenzerwald

The elegance of simplicity
A region for connoisseurs who love the good things in life. Famed for delicious mountain cheese and the Käsestrasse (Cheese Route). An amazing mix of traditional and contemporary architecture. Themed trails which tell fascinating stories. An interesting cultural landscape which is ideally suited for any kind of outdoor activity. The *Werkraum Haus* in Andelsbuch showcases craftsmanship and artistry. Worth listening to: the Schubertiade Festival concerts in Schwarzenberg.

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Brandnertal - Alpine City of Bludenz - Klostertal - Grosses Walsertal

Three awe-inspiring alpine valleys - Brandnertal, Klostertal, Grosses Walsertal - and the alpine city of Bludenz make for the charm of this region. 800 km of hiking trails, 300 km of mountain bike routes, two 18-hole golf courses, horseback riding, and archery all await action-hungry visitors. For families: inspiring nature explorations, game worlds, supervised activities, festivals. "Enjoy nature without harming it" is the motto to which the Grosses Walsertal biosphere park subscribes.



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Kleinwalsertal

Unspoilt mountains galore
36 summits line the valley which is accessible by car only via Germany. Hikers and bikers are drawn by an unspoilt, largely pristine mountain scenery. *Wälsler Omgang* is a tailor-made exercise and vitality programme for those who want to re-energize.
*Lebensfeuer** (lifeline) measurements diagnose your state of health, and customized recommendations help boost quality of living, health and performance potential.



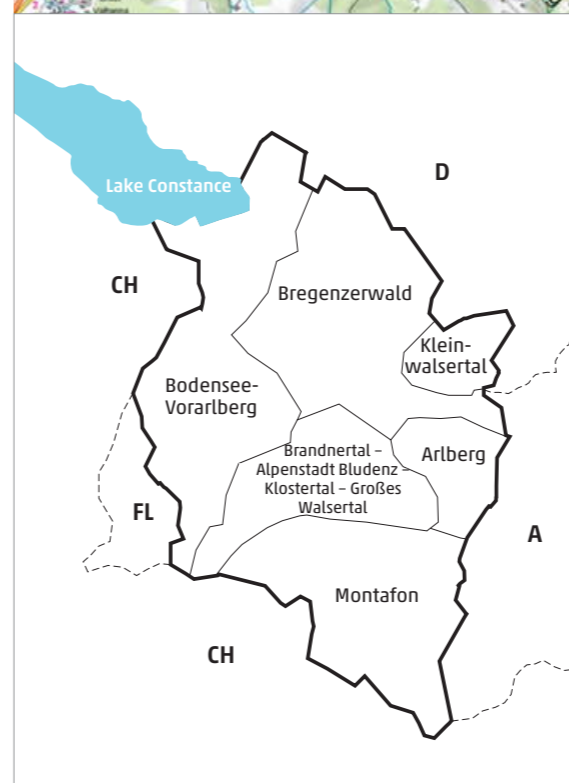
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Montafon

Hiking historic trails, conquering mountains on an ebike, fine dining in alpine lodges or mountain forest adventures feature in the programme of activities just as much as awesome challenges for zealous hobby athletes.

The wholesome mountain air is bracing and re-energizing. Themed trails tell interesting stories. Cosy lodges and mountain inns beckon a friendly welcome.

Hints for active holiday-makers

Exploring Lake Constance

Gentle shorelines, villages and towns in the foreground, mountains, hillsides and orchards in the background. A trip on Lake Constance unravels scenic views and novel perspectives. From the modern harbour of Bregenz, the vessels of the Lake Constance fleet head for attractive destinations around Lake Constance. www.bodenseeschiffahrt.at

Golfing with a view

Whether in the plains of the Rhine valley or in a mountain village, Vorarlberg's golf courses are set against the backdrop of stunning alpine scenery. There is a choice of four 18-hole courses and two 9-hole courses.

Hiking and breakfasting on the mountains

Give your day of hiking a delicious start: with a breakfast on the mountains paired with sublime panoramic views.

Min Weag – Circuit trail around Vorarlberg

"Min Weag" (My Way) is a new long-distance hiking trail which runs across all of Vorarlberg's landscapes on 31 legs. Starting at Lake Constance, the trail takes hikers via the Bregenzerwald, the Arlberg and the Montafon to Alpenregion Bludenz and into the Rhine valley. For details on the route, walking times, altitude profiles etc., check out the free Vorarlberg app, which features detailed information on other hiking and mountain bike routes as well. www.vorarlberg.travel/min-weag (in German only)

- In the Montafon, several mountain inns offering splendid views invite hikers all through the summer to a mountain breakfast. Some guided tours also include a mountain breakfast.
- In the Brandnertal, hikers are treated to a fine breakfast at lake Luenersee in the Douglasshütte hut above Brand on Fridays.
- In July and August, mountain breakfasts are offered on Saturdays on Muttersberg in Bludenz.
- In the Grosses Walsertal biosphere park, Andrea Schwarzmann treats visitors at Alpe Steris at given dates to an alp breakfast. The farmwoman serves home-made products, self-baked bread, alp cheese and the typical Riebel (a kind of corn meal fry). www.vorarlberg.travel/mountains-and-more

Moor hikes

What are the secrets of a moor? Individual or guided circuit tours across the moors in Krumbach yield insights and answers. Along the architect-designed trail, moor seats and the open *Moorroom* invite hikers to rest and contemplate. The four "moor innkeepers" in Krumbach refine their dishes and drinks with plants harvested in the moor. Moor hikes followed by themed moor dinners are arranged by the innkeepers during the moor weeks in spring and in autumn.

Listening to the echo

An echo wall? Head for Sonntag-Stein in the Grosses Walsertal biosphere park. You reach the wall on the themed *Klangraum Stein*, trail which features a number of artistic installations. Furniture to rest invites visitors to take in the surroundings, to reflect and listen, the podium at the echo wall amplifies the sounds of musicians playing at this site.

Kindling *Lebenfeuer** (lifefire)

How about my health and vitality? In the Kleinwalsertal, the world's first ever *Lebenfeuer** region, trained professionals do a diagnostic check-up of our lifefire by measuring heart rate variability and advise visitors on how to improve their quality of life. *Walser Omgang* is an exercise and vitality programme that comes with it. Several hiking trails generate different stimuli and sharpen the senses.

Spending the night at 2,000 m under the skies

- How does it feel to spend a night high up in the mountains? Visitors of Lech Zürs am Arlberg now have an opportunity to find out. The package combines hikes on the Green Ring around Lech Zürs which tells mystery tales and sagas with a night in a bivouac at 2,250 m above sea level.
- In the Montafon as well, hikers have a chance to reach for the skies. After a guided hike above Gaschurn, participants spend the night in an outdoor camp, mounting their own tent. Logwood for the campfire will be provided.

E-mountain biking in the mountains

Boosted by green energy, ascending a mountain becomes sheer effortless. In the Kleinwalsertal and in Lech am Arlberg, rental ebikes, a network of charging stations and guided tours are available. Aktivpark Montafon in Schruns Tschagguns is home to Vorarlberg's largest ebike base.

Inclusive Cards

Many attractions in the four-country region around Lake Constance are a must-see: museums or lookout points, Baroque monasteries or delicatessen manufacturers. If you are planning to visit more than just one attraction, you can benefit from different Inclusive Cards.

Regional Inclusive Cards

All of Vorarlberg's holiday destinations propose an inclusive card. Depending on the region, the cards are valid for public transport, lifts and cable-cars, museums, recreational facilities and enrolment in various programmes. In the Kleinwalsertal, the Bregenzerwald and on the Arlberg, the cards are included in the price of accommodation at the participating hotels and inns. In the Bodensee-Vorarlberg region, in the Montafon (Montafon-Silvretta Card) and in Alpenregion Bludenz, the cards are sold at an inexpensive all-in rate. www.vorarlberg.travel/inclusive-cards

The Lake Constance Adventure Card is valid from late March to late October on 3, 7 or 14 successive days. Depending on the type of card, it includes boat rides on the Lake Constance fleet, admission to some 180 tourist sites and discounts on leading destinations in the international Lake Constance region such as Mainau island. www.bodensee.eu

Imaginative: Sound Worlds and Art Spaces

The cultural scene is truly cosmopolitan: for decades, the Bregenz Festival has been a veritable tourist magnet, featuring spectacular opera performances on the floating stage of Lake Constance. Nature also plays a leading role in a string of other festivals. Museums and exhibitions open up novel perspectives.

Hints for culture lovers

Unique: The Bregenz Festival

The lakeside performances of the Bregenz Festival stun for their unrivalled ambience under the open skies, a spectacular setting, and first-class music. This year's programme also features a rarely played opera, orchestra concerts, and *Kunst aus der Zeit* (Art of the time), a series of contemporary art. Mid-July to mid-August.

Young: poolbar Festival in Feldkirch

For almost 20 years, the poolbar festival has been celebrating pop music, fashion, architecture and design. The main venue of this 6-week summer festival is the *Altes Hallenbad* in Feldkirch.

Classical: The Schubertiade Festival in Schwarzenberg/Hohenems

Franz Schubert would have been ever so fond of the site: Each year in June and in August/September, the picturebook Bregenzerwald village of Schwarzenberg hosts the world's most prominent Schubert festival. At given dates, festival concerts are also staged in Hohenems.

Groovy: *Bezaus Beatz & Jäzzspätzle*

At the festival weekend (early August) you will hear soul, funk and blues being performed in Bezaun in the Bregenzerwald. Twice or three times a year, *Jäzzspätzle* combines a jazz concert with a cheese spätzle tasting in an unusual setting.

Cheerful: *berge.hören*

Hiking, stopping for a bite and a rest at an alpine lodge, listening to new folk music in the great outdoors: in September, the *berge.hören* festival in the Brandnertal valley and in Alpenstadt Bludenz invites visitors for culture and pleasure walks.

Regional: Montafon Summer & Walsar Autumn

The Montafon Summer features trad & mod (late June/early July). Staged every other year in the Grosses Walsertal biosphere park, the Walsar Autumn combines theatre, music and literature, scheduled next for August/September 2014.

Inspiring: Philosophicum Lech

In September, philosophers, thinkers, literati and other interested visitors gather at the Philosophicum Lech. Each year, the several-day series of talks and debates is dedicated to a given subject.

Total Work of Art: Kunsthaus Bregenz

Designed by the renowned Swiss architect Peter Zumthor, the KUB building, which resembles a giant glass cube, stands in the vicinity of Lake Constance. KUB is among Europe's leading museums of contemporary art and houses varying exhibitions.

Revealing: Jewish Museum Hohenems

For centuries, Hohenems was home to a small Jewish community. Today, the painstakingly restored Jewish quarter and the Jewish Museum in Hohenems in the Villa Heimmann-Rosenthal testify to these times. The museum accommodates a modern-designed permanent exhibition and varying special exhibitions.

Diverting: Games and Adventure

Families visiting Vorarlberg are in for educational, entertaining and action-packed programmes, all under the motto of spending quality time with the loved ones and exploring unknown terrain together. Several resorts run programmes for families and children throughout the summer. Adventure trails, museums and farm visits promise undiluted fun.

Hints for Families

Paying a visit to goats and cows

Frolicking goats and grazing cows, rabbits and guinea pigs waiting to be petted. Some years ago, the Metzler family in Egg opened Vorarlberg's first open farm, practicing sustainable husbandry, where visitors can catch a glimpse of and find out about all farming processes hands-on. They can gaze at an impressive cattle run and a goat shed. Interested visitors may also enrol in a dairy-making class. Home-made products such as soft cheese or whey beauty products are sold directly on the farm.

Hiking from hut to hut

Out and about in the great outdoors, plenty of time for play and game, and spending the night at an alpine shelter. This is how hiking turns fun! The Bregenzerwald tourist office offers family walks from hut to hut which can be booked individually. The package includes two nights in an alpine shelter camping on mattresses, breakfast or optionally half board.

Touring with huskies

"My huskies love hiking and they love kids" says Husky Tony. At given dates in summer, Tony and his dogs accompany families around lake Luenersee in the Brandnertal valley. Hikers and dogs are connected by a waist belt. In this way, the dogs help with walking. En route, the party stops for a break and a rest at Alpe Lin.

Exploring the secrets of the mountains

How did the Alps come into being? Which animals and plants are native to the Brandnertal? And what about water and mountains? The new *Naturspruenge* theme park in the Brandnertal

provides answers to these questions and a lot more. At eleven interactive stations, visitors learn about the special characteristics and vital functions of an alpine region. The circuit is easy to negotiate and runs from the mountain terminal of the Panoramabahn ropeway to Alpe Parpienz, to the reservoir, before returning.

Boating on the Bear Lake

Young and adult explorers take a ride up to Sonnenkopf in the Klostertal on bear gondolas. Having reached the top, they can crawl into a bear cave, try out the bear playground, the water world, or take a rafting trip on the bear lake.

Tobogganing and Flying

Golm in the Montafon, the local mountain of Tschagguns and Vandans, has rich pickings for families with children, featuring the *Alpine-Coaster-Golm*, a sort of tobogganing run that is open all year round. The Golm forest rope park and the *Flying-Fox-Golm*, which whisks you across the Latschau reservoir, is also a magnetic draw. Original: Golm's research trail where 21 stations inform about local fauna and flora. The trail takes hikers to a water-borne see-saw, a nature memo and the medicinal herb Sudoku.

Please touch and try

A museum where you are allowed even meant to touch everything? At *inatura*, the interactive nature show in Dornbirn, this becomes real. Here, you can climb into a fox den, cuddle fish, experiment in the Science Center, walk through the human organ, or learn how the human body works in a playful manner.

Playing with Burmi

Burmi is the name of the jolly groundhog, the mascot of the Kleinwalsertal holiday programme for families. The little ones, and those young at heart, can find out more about the life of marmots at play and activity stations on the 500 m Long Marmot Trail. Here they can climb in the mini rope garden, hide in the Burmi cave, or enter a Burmi long-throw contest. There is also a barbecue site and a water treading basin.

No matter whether at a local inn or gourmet restaurant, an in-crowd eatery or wine tavern, guest satisfaction always reigns supreme. To the quality of food and drink, add a perfect setting and commitment to service by gastronomists and their staff. Hiking from course to course

The Bregenzerwald Tourist Board runs day tours which start with a mountain breakfast. These 3.5 to 5-hour tours take hikers to exceptionally scenic spots. Halts are planned for en route. The tours include breakfast, lunch and a dessert which are served at three different mountain inns or restaurants.

Dairy-farming courses

Premium quality milk, rennet, plenty of manual work and patience: at Ingo Metzler's dairy-farming school in Egg in the Bregenzerwald, at the Montafon Kaesehaus, and at Haus Walsertol in the Grosses Walsertal, interested visitors can learn how milk is processed into cheese. Courses are run at given dates, either for groups or individuals.

Learn about the secrets of cooking from professionals

Some of Vorarlberg's most outstanding chefs are keen to let interested hobby chefs into their secrets. Courses are run at given dates – early booking is strongly recommended as classes tend to sell out fast.

Tasteful gifts

From mountain cheese to chocolate, mustard to fine brandies: In Vorarlberg, many culinary delicacies are manufactured on small farms, dairy-farms and small manufacturing shops. To find out more about typical souvenirs visit www.vorarlberg.travel/en/souvenir

Soothing and pampering

In recent years, many feel-well hosts have modernised and generously extended their hotels and spa areas in the style of contemporary Vorarlberg (timber) architecture.

Shaped to perfection: Architecture and Artisanry

Architecture and design in Vorarlberg is different. Modern. Daring. Trailblazing. In their work, Vorarlberg's artists do not take their cue from fashion. They rely on age-old building traditions which have been handed down for generations and on a natural sense of what best fits a particular site. A sparing use of natural resources is just as important.

Hints for Aesthetes

Eye-catching: vorarlberg museum in Bregenz

A dark-colour schemed room and floor-to-ceiling windows which afford views of Lake Constance and surrounding nature: From the 4th floor showroom of the vorarlberg museum in Bregenz, designed by the Austrian artist Florian Pumhösl, the view extends to an ever changing scenery. Adorned by 16,656 concrete "flowers", the facade is in itself an original work of art. Inside, the museum stages entertaining exhibitions on Vorarlberg's past and present.

Craftsmanship & design: *Werkraum Haus* in the Bregenzerwald

With its elongated shape and lined by glass all round, the *Werkraum Haus* stands prominently in the centre of Andelsbuch in the Bregenzerwald. A glimpse from outside reveals numerous implements as well as the surrounding landscape through the all-round floor-to-ceiling windows. It is worthwhile to step inside and marvel at the works of some 80 innovative Bregenzerwald *Werkraum* craftspeople and changing special exhibitions. The *Werkraum Haus* was designed as a showcase of craftsmanship and artisanry and as a place of encounter. It also accommodates a small cafe and a shop. The building was designed by the internationally renowned Swiss architect Peter Zumthor, who feels strongly about artisanry and in particular about Bregenzerwald craftsmanship.

Hydro-engineering & power: *Illwerke centre* in the Montafon

In late 2013 one of the world's largest CO₂-neutral timber-hybrid office buildings opened in Vandans-Rodund in the Montafon. Architect Hermann Kaufmann designed this hydro-engineering centre of the Vorarlberg Illwerke plants as a green building according to passive house standards.

Architecture discovery and hikes

• The Bodensee-Vorarlberg Tourist Board is offering a weekend package "Architecture and culture live!" for visitors interested in architecture. The package includes accommodation in a 4-star hotel of architectural interest, admission to the vorarlberg museum in Bregenz and to Kunsthaus Bregenz together with a guided architectural visit.

• A several-day architectural walk in the Bregenzerwald traces the footsteps of traditional and contemporary architecture.
